Giving Back One Bar at a Time

Have you ever thought about what happens to that bar of soap in your hotel room you only used once? One man did while visiting a hotel in 2008 and since then has founded Clean The World.

Quality Hospitality, soap, shampoos, conditioners, lotions, and the like in our hotels gets recycled through Hilton's

participation with Clean The World.

The Clean the World Organization recycles, repackages, and then repurposes the soaps and bottles by donating them to underdeveloped areas that will benefit.

Here's how it works: Items like soap bars and bottles of lotion are taken from rooms after guests stay with us and are placed in designated boxes to be donated to Clean

The World. Then, they sort through the items, clean, sanitize, and repackage the products. The repurposed goods are then sent to those in need in countries all over the world.

Over the past few years of

participation, Quality Hospitality hotels have been able to recycle thousands of soaps to be distributed to those in need. In our Homewood Suites by Hilton Atlanta I-85-Lawrenceville-Duluth alone, 1,090 soap bars were distributed and 94 lbs. of plastics were recycled just in 2018 alone.

Our hotels continue to work with the Clean the World organization to keep soap out of the landfill and also impact the lives of millions around the world.

Saltine Toffee

4oz saltine crackers | 1 cup butter | 1 cup dark brown sugar | 2 cups chocolate morsels | 3/4 cup Heath Candy pieces or chopped nuts

- $^{\circ}$ Preheat oven to 400°. Line a cookie sheet with parchment paper or Silpat mat.
- Combine sugar and butter in a medium sauce pan and bring to a boil. Let boil for 3 mins. Pour immediately over saltines making sure all the crackers are completely covered.
- Bake at 400° for 5 6 minutes. Remove from oven and sprinkle chocolate morsels over the top. Let sit for 5 minutes. Spread melted chocolate and top with candy pieces or nuts. Refrigerate toffee for 2 hours. Once set, break into pieces and enjoy!

While Cedric was just outside of Rieglewood he came upon a car in the flooding and as he got out of the truck he heard the woman inside yelling for help. Her car was sinking below the water fast where Hwy 87 had been. He managed to pull her from the vehicle, and as the National Guard arrived they were able to remove the man from the car as well. They were air-lifted to the nearest hospital in critical condition. Emergency crews arrived and pulled their car from the flooded waters. We all hope they are doing well today. Meanwhile, Reliable Tank Line is taking safety to a whole different level by adding 'Video Intelligence' to the fleet. This initiative involves putting three cameras on each tractor in the fleet. One is a forward -facing camera mounted on the windshield and two rear-facing cameras mounted on each of the side mirrors. "The video coverage provided by these cameras are meant to make us a safer company. This technology allows Reliable Tank Line to have event-driven and/or on-demand video at our fingertips. Our goal is to live up to one of Core Ideology points: to be better today than yesterday.", said Buddy Jenkins, SVP of Reliable Tank Line. We hope to have all 150 trucks with cameras installed by the end of January.

Tips for a Safe and Healthy Holiday Season

We all know the Holidays take a toll on our health, both mentally and physically. Here's some tips from the CDC to help you out this year.

1 Wash your hands often.

Keeping hands clean is one of the most important steps you can take to avoid getting sick and spreading germs to others. Wash your hands with soap and clean running water for at least 20 seconds. If soap

and clean water are not available, use an alcohol-based product.

2 Stay warm.

Cold temperatures can cause serious health problems, especially in infants and older adults. Stay dry, and dress warmly in several layers of loosefitting, tightly woven clothing. Check on children, the elderly and pets.

3 Manage stress.

The holidays don't need to take a toll on your health. Keep a check on overcommitment and over-spending. Balance work, home, and play. Get support from family and friends. Keep a relaxed and positive outlook. Get enough sleep.

4 Travel safely.

Whether you're traveling across town or around the world, help ensure your trip is safe. Don't drink and drive, and don't let someone else drink and drive. Wear a seat

belt every time you drive or ride in a motor vehicle. Always buckle your child in the car using a child safety seat, booster seat, or seat belt according to his/ her height, weight, and age. Get vaccinations if traveling out of the country.



5 Get check-ups and stay up to date on vaccinations.

Exams and screenings can help find problems early or before they start. Vaccinations help prevent diseases and save lives. Schedule a visit with your health care provider for a yearly exam. Ask what vaccinations and tests you should get based on your age, lifestyle, travel plans, medical history, and family health history.

6 Handle and prepare food safely.

As you prepare holiday meals, keep you and your family safe from food-related illness. Wash hands and surfaces often. Avoid cross-contamination by keeping raw meat, poultry, seafood, and eggs (including their juices) away from ready -to-eat foods and eating surfaces. Cook foods to the proper temperature. Refrigerate promptly. Do not leave perishable foods out for more than two hours.

7 Eat healthy and be active.

With balance and moderation, you can enjoy the holidays the healthy way. Choose more vegetables and fruit. Select just one or two of your favorites from the host of tempting foods. Find

fun ways to stay active, such as dancing to your favorite holiday music. Be active for at least 21/2 hours a week. Help kids and teens be active for at least 1 hour a day. As always, you can check with HR should you have any questions.
